



Snowmobile Rides!

Our insurance company requires us to have a release form on file, giving permission for our athletes to ride on the snowmobiles. A parent, guardian or the athlete who is his/her own guardian, must sign the enclosed release form before we can allow them to ride on the AMVETS snowmobiles.

Please bring these signed forms to the Snowmobile Ride location on Monday January 27th at Sugarloaf. Any questions, please call 879-0489 and speak to any staff member. **REMEMBER – no permission slip – no ride!**

Questions & Answers

- Q. Who drives the machines?
A. *Our machines are furnished by members of the Jay AMVETS, who drive their own machines.*
- Q. What is the course like?
A. *The machines will follow an approved trail on the Snubber Chairlift area*
- Q. How many athletes on a machine at one time?
A. *One*
- Q. Do athletes wear helmets?
A. *Yes*
- Q. Do athletes need permission from a parent/guardian to ride?
A. *Yes, we have a form that MUST be filled out.*
- Q. How fast does the machine travel?
A. *At a reasonable speed – no fast rides.*
- Q. Are athletes covered by S.O. insurance when riding on the machine?
A. *No*
